

Thank you to all schools

What an incredible couple of years!

Thank you to each and every school for your wonderful support to the project and to the Emotionally Healthy Schools team here at Redwood Primary school. Of course, we could never have predicted just how important this project would be and you have all risen to the challenge.

We have met and exceeded all expectations for this project and the outcomes have been incredible. Every single school in Derby City has committed to developing mental health. Not one of you opted out. Out of the 104 schools who were initially eligible for this programme, 106 completed diagnostic tools and 107 trained a Designated Senior Lead for Mental Health, with schools outside the initial remit asking to also be part of it. 76 have gone for the full mental health in schools award, with 6 achieving the gold.

Over 300 teaching staff have attended our workshops and networks, with nearly 1000 watching our recordings. We've had some of the world experts on school mental health talk to us exclusively, such as Prof. Barry Carpenter, Dr. Dan Siegel, Natasha Devon and Dr. Frances Maratos. Special thanks also go to Jill Mahon from Trauma Informed Schools UK, who gifted their time to talk to us and to support some of our schools affected by fires this term.

91 schools have chosen to submit their school action plans in order to access grant funding for their schools and we have given some funding to every single school in Derby, with £141,000 in initial grants and a further £86,000 in additional, competitive grant funding. This includes whole school training, books and resources, mental health first aid, developing nurture provisions and outdoor learning environments and much, much more.

Derby is now very much on the map for having some of the very best practice in the country for school mental health and wellbeing.
