Upcoming Training

38 schools now have a fully trained Designated Senior Lead for Mental Health in their school!

And every other state funded or local authority school in the City, is due to follow shortly, with the next wave of training starting on 25 and 26 September. If you're not sure which training date you're booked on, please get in touch.

97% of attendees felt that their confidence has improved and we have already seen increased confidence from schools in their ability to support children and young people in their schools around their mental health.

In order to share our approach and practice with local schools, we are facilitating three training workshops led by Asmaa Ahmed (Mental Health and Trauma Informed Practitioner). These workshops are designed to empower school staff and child-serving professionals to understand the needs of Primary School students who have experienced trauma or have a mental health issue.
